Dear Friends,

This month we look forward to a number of very special events in worship, with the following schedule:

Sunday, May 1—Handel's Messiah Our sanctuary choir, accompanied by a small orchestra, will present excerpts from parts II and III (crucifixion and resurrection sections) of Handel's Messiah at the 10:30 worship hour. There will be Communion at the 8:30 and 9:30 hours only (there will be a Communion opportunity later in the month at the 10:30 hour on May 15). The sermon series on "Christ Versus the Powers of Evil" continues at all three hours.

**Sunday, May 8—Mother's Day and Children's Choir Musical** Our Children's Choir will present the delightful musical, "Spend a While on the Nile," at the 10:30 service. Resurrection will also sing at 9:30 and 10:30. New Spirit will be doing the prelude for the 10:30 service. The sermon series concludes with a sermon entitled, "Ghostbusters."

**Sunday, May 15—Confirmation/Pentecost** We celebrate Confirmation at the 10:30 hour, which also includes Communion. ZAMARingers will play the offertory. At all three hours we celebrate Pentecost—the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the disciples and the birthday of the church.

**Sunday May 22—Graduate Recognition** We will recognize our high school graduates at all three worship hours. Seniors are asked to communicate to Rick Stout which service(s) they are planning to attend. The recognition at the 10:30 hour will be prior to 10:50, so that seniors will be able to depart from the service in time for Baccalaureate. There will also be a recognition of senior ZAMARingers. The Chancel Ringers will play for the final time this spring. There will also be a **brass quintet** playing at the 10:30 hour.

Sunday, May 29—UMW Sunday A team of our United Methodist Women will present the message, using a lively mix of drama, word, and song. Since this is also Memorial Day weekend, we will have geraniums adorning the sanctuary (given in honor or memory of veterans), and we will have a moment of recognition for veterans during worship. There will be a Blanket Sunday offering on this day.

# Kent Interfaith Alliance for Reconciliation and Justice

## Statement Against the Language of Hate and a Call for Civility in Public Discourse

The Kent Interfaith Alliance for Reconciliation and Justice is a group of local, faith-based leaders in the Kent and Portage County area. Brought together by our concerns about racism, injustice, cross-cultural conflict, and inter-cultural conflict, we believe in the power of constructive, faith-based action.

As such, we are disturbed by the rise of violence and destruction of human life around the globe and are concerned by the lack of civility that we witness in public discourse.

Daily, we are confronted by the people or groups who use ideologies, policies, systems, and even religion to bring about the destruction of human life. We are witness to a convergence of a massive global refugee crisis, a sentiment of fear resulting from heinous terrorist attacks, and the rise of a rhetoric of exclusion and vilification that runs counter to our faith understandings.

As people of faith, we recognize and affirm that all people are created in the image of God, and therefore, heeding the words of many sacred scriptures, we are disturbed by language that vilifies, excludes, or in any way negates the worth of all peoples.

We believe that since all human beings are made in God's likeness, that an offense against our neighbor is an offense against God. We believe that violence begets violence, in speech and in action.

Therefore, as members of the Kent Interfaith Alliance for Reconciliation and Justice, we call on all leaders and civilians to:

- Work for and promote policies that embrace the understanding that humans created in the image of God all have worth and value
- Work for justice and equity for all people irrespective of race, ethnicity, religion, economic status, ability, or other human differences
- Work for inclusion and participation of all peoples in the life of society
- Work to end and condemn all language used by public officials that debases, vilifies, or in any way promotes hate

- Work for and support policies that condemn all acts of terrorism and violence perpetrated in the name of religion
- Work for and support practices of humane and inclusive welcome for refugees

As an organization, we live in hope that peace and justice will prevail for all of God's children

### **East Ohio Summer Camps**

- Go to www.eastohiocamps.org and register online for the camp of your choice.
- Print the confirmation.
- Bring in or mail a copy of the confirmation, to our church office, PO Box 646, Kent, OH 44240 (specifically to Lynnette Begue-Lavery, our financial coordinator). The church will then send in a payment to the camp's office for half of the Tier III price of your camp, and that office will bill you for the rest.

If you need further financial assistance, see Lynnette about receiving application materials for a District or Conference campership. It is possible to get nearly the entire cost of camp covered if you have the need.

Summer camp is a fun-filled time of spiritual growth and making new friends in God's great out-of-doors. For more information, contact Dr. Palmer.

### **Rachel Palmer Receives United Methodist Peace with Justice Scholarship**

Rachel Palmer has received the 2016 East Ohio Conference Peace with Justice Scholarship, which is awarded to one high school senior each spring. A second Peace with Justice scholarship is available to students already in college. The scholarship is a competitive, essay-based scholarship available to United Methodist students in east Ohio, Applicants must articulate an understanding of the Biblical concept of peace with justice, showing how that understanding applies to today's circumstances, and must demonstrate a commitment to the work of peace with justice. Rachel lifted up the Biblical concept of "welcoming the stranger" (foreigner), and focused on the problem of Syrian refugees; she identified German Chancellor Angela Merkel as a model of exemplary leadership in response to the refugee crisis. Rachel also wrote about her intention to study international relations in college, with the hope of working in a field relating to human rights.

The Peace with Justice Scholarship is one of several essay-based scholarships that are available each spring through the East Ohio Conference. A full listing can be found at the conference website, www.eocumc.com/scholarships.
