Youth Ministry News June 2016

As you may be aware this year the Kent school district altered its calendar, starting school in mid-August and ending in late May. As a result we have altered the youth calendar to match the changes in the school year. While this makes May a very busy month as we seem to rush to get everything in, I feel the changes in the calendar and switching youth group to Sunday have been very successful.

I am also happy that the business of the end of the school year and its many school activities has done little to slow down the activity level of our youth group. On May 15, eight members of our seventh grade class officially finished confirmation and became members of our church. Also on May 15, the new members of our Mountain TOP team officially finished tool training in preparation for our trip to Tennessee on July 9. We also will be sending a team of sixteen to Minnesota to the Leech Lake reservation June 25–July 2. Saturday May 21 the winning team from our 30 hour famine scavenger hunt spent an hour "trapped" in Cleveland as they tried to use their intellect and teamwork to escape the impending approach of a masked chainsaw murderer. And on May 22, we officially concluded the year with graduate recognition and our end or the year youth picnic.

Overall, I couldn't be happier about how this year has gone. We successfully altered the youth schedule, moving youth group to Sunday evenings. In the fall the youth hosted 5th Quarter and Halloween parties that drew over 100 students each. In February we raised over \$1,700 for World Vision during our famine event and collected hundreds of canned goods for Kent Social Services. The youth also performed a Christmas play for the 9:30 worship hour; put on an excellent Youth Sunday; hosted a successful auction; and over the summer will be sending 40 to Mountain TOP and 16 to Minnesota. When adding in all the nights of special times of worship and the confirmation of our seventh grade, I think you will agree our youth have been very blessed this year. I can't wait to see what God has in mind for next year!


