Dear Friends,

This fall is the 500th anniversary of the Protestant Reformation. On October 31, 1517, Martin Luther nailed his "95 theses" on the door of his church in Wittenberg—galvanizing a movement to reform the church that would ultimately transform the world. That movement continues to shape our church and society today.

So this fall I will be doing a sermon series entitled, "Here We Stand— Sure Faith in Uncertain Times." The title alludes to Luther's famous statement when he was pressed by Catholic authorities to renounce his beliefs—"Here I stand." In the midst of social and political turbulence and great pressures, Luther stood firm in faith. We are invited to do likewise in our time!

Although the Reformation was 500 years ago, the insights of that time—and the conviction that Protestant reformers displayed—can help us to be clear about where we stand in our faith today. Each week of the sermon series we will lift up a key spiritual principle from the Reformation, and we will see how we also can have sure faith in uncertain times.

The sermon titles in the coming month are as follows:

September 3—"Know the Truth"

September 10—"Saved by Grace"

September 17—"Have Faith"

September 24—"It Is Clear in the Cross"

October 1—"We Are All First String"

When we actually arrive at "Reformation Sunday"—the last Sunday in October—we will have a very special musical element in our 10:30 service, as our Sanctuary Choir will present "Ein' feste Burg ist unser Gott" (A Mighty Fortress Is Our God), a cantata by Johann Sebastian Bach, based on Luther's most famous hymn. The sermon series will conclude in November.

For those interested in learning more background and history, our University of Life—which offers short courses for adults at the 9:30 hour—will offer an excellent course on the Reformation that is described below.

Summer mission trips in review

As promised, I'd like to give everyone the opportunity to read a little about this year's Mountain T.O.P. experience. I have asked Hannah Holman and Carlie Thompson to share with you about their trip I hope you enjoy reading about it as much as I did sharing in it.

Greetings my name is Hanna Holman and a few weeks ago I was part of the Adults in Ministry part of Mountain T.O.P., and I participated in a program called Quest. Quest is a day camp for kids ages 12–17 that live throughout the county. At first, I was very hesitant to commit to the program. I was very very comfortable with minor home repair, and I knew that I absolutely loved it. It was one of the first times I completely put all of my trust in the Lord, for a new and different experience like this to pay off for me.

Needless to say, of course it did. We had themes for each day, trust, responsibility, teamwork, and respect, and had activities to do respective to the theme. We went canoing, zip lining, horseback riding, biking, and even swimming. I know what you're thinking...."Wow! Sounds like a vacation!"...but these tasks were specifically chosen to put these teens in controlled stressful situations, so they could learn safe and effective ways of handling stress that they may come upon throughout their lives.

These children were truly special, and they amazed me everyday that we worked with them. Just the way that they handled themselves, and smiled all day, everyday, even when I knew the extent of how they had been living. I went up to one of the boys house, his name was Chris, and he actually had holes in the floor of his kitchen.... I mean I don't know about you, but I can never ever imagine living like that.

Unlike them, I am on a great path to a good college, have solid floor, I actually just got a new roof, and I have never even given it a second thought. Of course I'm going to go to college, of course my moms going to have a nice meal waiting for me when I get home. Why would it ever be any other way? But for so many of these kids, it's not that way at all.

It was extremely eye opening and heartbreaking to see first hand what some people are born into, and the challenges that will face in their lives while trying to reach success. Quest was designed to give these children a out and a way to see that there is hope, and that there is love, and that there is always another way, that they're never truly stuck. That week at Mountain T.O.P. I learned that God doesn't care about your comfort zone, he cares about your character. And participating in Quest that week was exactly what I needed to be the hands and feet of Christ.

Carlie Thompson writes: My Mountain T.O.P. experience has truly impacted my life in so many great ways. This was my 3rd year at Mountain T.O.P. and my second year of day camp. My favorite part about day camp is the kids of course but also how much you connect with kids that just need love in one short week.

This year I had a kid that connected with me since the minute she got in the car. She sat down next to me and said "Hi, I'm Emaleigh and we're gonna be best friends". And since that moment she was always next me and wanted carried. She started crying on Wednesday and we asked her why she was so upset and she said you're leaving Friday and I'll never see you again. That showed me how much of an impact I had on her in 3 days.

It's amazing to see that the kids remember you forever. Last year my buddy was Bailey and like Emaleigh she wanted to be carried everywhere. I don't have a single picture from last year of her not being held in my arms. She had so much love to give me and I had so much to give her. Bailey had two other sister that connected with others from Greensburg UMC. From the time I left Mountain T.O.P. last year, I had put a picture of Bailey as my background on my phone, and today, it's still her.

I was very upset during the week to find out the girls weren't at camp the week I was at Mountain T.O.P. But God working in his mysterious ways a group doing service project built a new porch for a family that had 3 little girls Hailey, Bailey and Tiffany. So I was given the opportunity to send a letter and pictures to the girls just to see how things were going.

At dinner that night Danny who met the girls while building the porch had brought me three letters one from each girl and I immediately started to cry. Thursday Brooke was told she was finishing the porch at their house and she had also known the girls and she told me if my driver was cool with it I could go see the girls on Friday after we dropped off our day campers I got out of the car and all three girls came running toward me and I got to see my girl Bailey.

This was by far my favorite year on the mountain because of these day camp kids who have taught me to be grateful for what I have and caring for the people I love.
