In worship this month, we look forward to the following special elements:

Sunday, December 31: On the morning of New Year's Eve, we will have our regular Sunday morning schedule, with worship at 8:30, 9:30, and 10:30 a.m. All three services will use a service of covenant renewal – designed to lead us to renew our relationship with God. What better way to start the new year! The service is based on a covenant renewal service designed by Methodist founder John Wesley for use on New Year's Eve or day.

Thanks to your support when men, women & children are experiencing homelessness in the Portage County Area and across Ohio they can turn to Miller Community House for help. We are able to give them the critical support that they so desperately need by providing them with emergency shelter and supportive on-site case management.
