This month we begin to move into the "holiday season," with a number of special events in worship. Our schedule includes:

- Sunday, Nov. 3—ALL SAINTS SUNDAY, COMMUNION. Worship at all hours will include a remembrance of loved ones who have died during the past year. There were opportunities to submit names of persons to be remembered on the last two Sundays in October, and you can submit a name through the church web site at www.kentmethodist.org/saints until October 30.
- **Sunday, Nov 10—NEW MEMBERS JOIN; BAPTISM.** See the relevant articles in this newsletter about the new member orientation and the opportunity for infant baptism.
- Sunday, Nov. 17—JOINT UMC/UCC CHOIR PRESENTATION OF THE VIVALDI GLORIA. At the 10:30 hour on this Sunday, the combined sanctuary choirs of our church and the United Church of Christ, along with a small orchestra, will present Vivaldi's "Gloria" as a portion of the worship hour. The combined choir will appear at the UCC church on the previous Sunday. This is a marvelous collaboration of our music programs to bring what will certainly be a very uplifting musical word of praise into our sanctuary service. The 8:30 and 9:30 hours will feature expanded musical selections in other styles.
- **Sunday, Nov. 24—THANKSGIVING SUNDAY.** We give God thanks for our blessings, as the worship hour will have a Thanksgiving theme. Our children will do their traditional Thanksgiving Parade at the close of the 10:30 worship hour. The ZAMARingers will play at both 9:30 and 10:30.
- Tuesday, Nov. 26, 7:00 pm—ECUMENICAL THANKSGIVING SERVICE AT UCC CHURCH. We are joining with other area churches in this ecumenical service to offer thanksgiving to God. It will take place in the sanctuary of the Kent United Church of Christ, located across the street.
- **Sunday, Dec. 1—FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT.** Our seasonal Christmas decorations will be in place, and we begin lighting the Advent candles each Sunday.

Janus Circle is sponsoring a special training opportunity for anyone in our church community who would like to know more about supporting those in the LGBTQ+ community. We know our church is a welcoming place, and we encourage everyone to come learn more about ways we can be better allies.

Our trainer is Ken Ditlevson, M.Ed., LPCC-S, the Director of Kent State University's Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer and Questioning Plus (LGBTQ+) Center. Ditlevson is a two-time graduate of Kent State, having received a Bachelor of Arts in Psychology and Master of Education in community counseling.

The goals of Safe Space Allies Training are:

- To develop a deeper awareness of personal ideas, stereotypes, and assumptions related to gay, lesbian, bisexual, transgender, queer, and questioning (LGBTQ+) individuals.
- To develop an increased comfort level in addressing concepts and language regarding LGBTQ+ communities.
- To develop an increased awareness of services in the community that supports LGBTQ+ and allied individuals.
- To develop a network and community to support people of all sexual orientations, gender identities, and gender expressions within our communities and in our workplaces.


A Time to be Thankful
