In more than 25 years as the senior pastor of UMC Kent, I do not believe I have ever missed a Sunday due to illness. I thank God for good health! Of course I have had bouts with flu, colds, and a case of shingles, but it all somehow happened in between Sundays. In the last full week of September, I contracted Covid-19, which I got from visiting my son Joshua at Mount Union. He subsequently tested positive for Covid, along with other mem-

bers of the soccer team. Josh felt ill for a few days but then rebounded quickly. Being the old guy that I am, I have been struggling with the symptoms for a longer period. One of my worst days was Sunday, Sept. 27. But Doug Denton was already scheduled to preach! I cannot return to the church building for worship on October 4, but I will record the sermon ahead of time for use at all three worship hours. We might as well keep the streak going!

In our family in Kent, we have been wearing masks whenever we have been out in public for months; and at the University of Mount Union this fall, there has been a detailed Covid-19 protocol in place. At the time we visited Josh there were only six reported cases on campus—all of them quarantined. But we were in the wrong place at precisely the wrong time—the few days between when Josh was exposed and when he knew he was infected. It reminds me that illness and misfortune can simply happen to people. As it is said in the book of Ecclesiastes, "The race is not to the swift or the battle to the strong, nor does food come to the wise or wealth to the brilliant or favor to the learned; but time and chance happen to them all." (Ecclesiastes 9:11)

Yet within the vagaries of life, God is at work. I have been sustained by a deep awareness of the presence of God, and a confidence in what we proclaim every Sunday—God is good, all the time. In my case, I have been blessed to have had a relatively mild set of symptoms (though they have been unpleasant enough). I think of all those people for whom Covid-19 has been far more serious. In all times of illness and trouble, I rest in the conviction that we can find our real help and strength and hope in God. As the Psalmist said, "God drew me up out of the desolate pit, out of the miry bog. God set my feet upon a rock, making my steps secure." (Psalm 40:2)

So I have had my own personal health battle to go along with the current sermon series—"Winning Life's Battles with the Armor of Faith." That series continues through this month. It reflects the fact that people of faith may face all sorts of battles in life. But we find the answer when, as the Scripture says, we "put on the full armor of God." (Ephesians 6:11)
