This week, the first week in April, is Holy Week. We look forward to these special opportunities:

• Maundy Thursday, April 1 – prayer stations in the sanctuary. Stations based on the stations of the cross will be set up around the sanctuary; at the final station you will be able to receive Communion. You can come to the

sanctuary any time from 10:00 a.m. until 8:30 p.m. and move at your own pace through the stations. Masks are required. Note that this is the Communion opportunity for the month of April. We do not have Communion on Easter.

- **Good Friday, April 2 livestreamed worship service at 7:30 p.m.** This will be a complete Good Friday service led by our Worship Band. Henrique Alvim will bring the message for the evening. As usual, the service will continue to be available as a recording, so that it can be accessed at any time after the livestreaming.
- Easter Sunday, April 4 At 8:30, we will have our usual in-person service in the sanctuary. This is an abbreviated service with no singing; the music is the organ prelude and postlude. Participants wear masks and sit widely spaced apart. At 9:30, we will have an outdoor worship service in the parking lot behind the church. You can park along the perimeter of the lot and bring a lawn chair to set up in a large area that we will have blocked off. We will also have metal folding chairs available. Since everyone can socially distance and wear masks, and since we will be outside, *everyone* can come! (You do not need to be vaccinated.) The weather forecast is currently favorable, but keep checking our web site for weather updates, as we will have to cancel the outdoor service if it is raining. The service will be livestreamed in any case. This will be the contemporary service, with music led by our worship band. At 10:30, our traditional Easter service will be livestreamed as usual.

Wednesday Lenten Devotions are available as a recorded series online. You can connect with these by clicking on the "Musical Performances" button in the livestreaming section of our web site. Also remember that **Sunday School** continues to be available in video form, with separate videos for preschool and elementary aged children; these can be accessed through our web site.

Our **Second Sunday** virtual gathering takes place at 11:30 a.m. on the second Sunday of each month. This will be on April 11.

The sermon series entitled, "Out of Exile into Hope" comes to its conclusion on Easter. I will be starting a new sermon series in April entitled, "The Truth Will Set You Free." In light of the many falsehoods that have spread in our age, it is extremely valuable to hear what God's Word tells us about Truth!

As noted previously, we expect to return to regular in-person worship on a yet-to-be-determined Sunday in May. We will provide updates in worship and in our Weekly Word emails during April. We look forward to finally emerging out of our long pandemic "exile." Yet through it all God has been good– all the time!
