As you know, the rollout of the vaccine has been much slower that originally envisioned, due to short supplies, and this affects our target dates for gradually returning to regular in-person worship. At present, most of our worship leaders have not been able to receive the first vaccine shot, which means we cannot restart in-person worship as we had hoped during Holy Week. We now anticipate a restart sometime in May. But we have exciting new plans for special worship opportunities coming up, in particular:

- In-person worship on Easter Sunday, April 4 We are planning outdoor worship at the 9:30 hour for all who wish to attend. Since we will be outside, distanced, and wearing masks (except for the worship leaders who will be a good distance from the congregation), *everyone* can come! We will block off a large area of the parking lot behind Pierson Hall. People attending should bring lawn chairs to use for seating (although we will also have some extra metal folding chairs available). You can park along the parking lot perimeter and then set up your chairs wherever you wish in the blocked off area. Worship will be the contemporary service, with music led by our worship band. We hope to stream the service for those who will be connecting online, or at least to post a recording; some details are still in the works, and we will provide updates in the near future. *Please note* that the outdoor service is weather dependent. If it is raining, or extremely cold, the outdoor gathering will be cancelled and the service will be broadcast through the usual livestreaming. There will be weather-related updates posted on our web site. Note that there is also **in-person worship every** Sunday at 8:30 in the sanctuary. This is an abbreviated service, with the only music being the organ prelude and postlude; people sit widely spaced in the sanctuary wearing masks. The 10:30 traditional Easter service will be livestreamed as usual. We expect to do the outdoor service as a special event only on Easter, as it requires considerable special preparations and rental of some sound equipment.
- We will have prayer stations in the sanctuary on Maundy Thursday, April 1. Stations based on the stations of the cross will be set up around the sanctuary; at the final station you will be able to receive Communion. You can come to the sanctuary any time from 10:00 a.m. until 8:30 p.m. and move at your own pace through the stations. Masks are required. The format will be similar to what we did for Ash Wednesday; the many people who came to that stations worship experience found it quite meaningful.
- A Good Friday worship service will be livestreamed on April 2 at 7:30 p.m. This will be a complete Good Friday service led by our Worship Band. Henrique Alvim will bring the message for the evening. As usual, the service will continue to be available as a recording, so that it can be accessed at any time after the livestreaming.
- **Wednesday Lenten Devotions** are offered in an online format. Each Wednesday at 7:30 p.m., a new 10–15 minute video devotion goes online, featuring inspirational music and Scriptures.

These can be accessed from the main page or the livestreaming section of our web site.

Meanwhile, **our regular pandemic worship format continues**, with the 9:30 and 10:30 services livestreamed each Sunday, and subsequently available as recordings, and with in-person worship for a small crowd offered at 8:30 in the sanctuary. **Sunday School** continues to be available in video form, with separate videos for preschool and elementary aged children; these can be accessed through our web site. **Youth Group**, for sixth through twelfth graders, is meeting each Sunday at 7:00 p.m.; masks are required. Our **Second Sunday** virtual gathering takes place at 11:30 a.m. on the second Sunday each month (March 11 this month).

In spite of the pandemic, we continue to find many ways to connect and to grow in spirit!


