Dear Friends,



Our return to regular in-person worship continues, as expected, to be a gradual process. In-person worship attendance has been slowly increasing at all services from week to week, while at the same time our online attendance continues to be larger than the in-person congregation. However people choose to attend,

we are joining in worship!

Our Covid policy is now that we are mask-optional at all three worship hours. Persons who are not vaccinated are of course strongly urged to wear a mask while in the building! Persons who are vaccinated can choose whether to wear a mask or not. We encourage everyone to keep in touch with CDC guidance, which is continually being adjusted, and to keep in mind the basic reality that fully vaccinated people almost never get infected and only in extremely rare cases will transmit the virus (even the new variant), while the unvaccinated are highly at risk. Our biggest recommendation as a church is to get vaccinated! – for the sake of self and neighbor. Also in keeping with CDC guidance, our Education Wing remains the one area of our church where everyone wears a mask.

As we head toward into August and September, we have several major opportunities approaching:

- Disciple I Bible Study begins on Tuesday, August 17. We still have a few openings for this through-the-Bible study, which I will be leading this year and next. For those seeking to plan ahead, I expect that the 2022-23 Disciple I class will meet on Mondays. You can sign up for this year's class in the atrium and online.
- Disciple II Bible Study begins on Wednesday, Sept. 8. A sign-up for this advanced class, for those who have completed Disciple I, is also available in the atrium and online.
- The Confirmation Luncheon, which provides an orientation to our Confirmation program, will be at 11:30 on Sunday, August 29. Because of delays related to Covid, the upcoming class will include seventh, eighth, and ninth graders. Detailed information will be mailed out to all families of seventh, eighth, and ninth graders in the coming days.
- Our Bible Presentation Sunday, when we will present Bibles to both third and fourth graders, will be on September 19. There will be a luncheon about our Bible mentor program after the 10:30 services. Detailed information will be mailed out to all families of third and fourth graders in the coming days.
- Our annual Church Picnic will be on Sunday, September 12, at 11:30 in Pierson Hall. This celebrates the return to our full fall schedule. All the food is provided; a freewill offering will be taken.
- Children's Choir, Chancel Ringers, and ZAMARingers will all resume regular rehearsals on September 12. There will be an introductory event for children who may be interested in ZAMARingers on Sunday, August 29. Details will be mailed out to families this month.

In worship, the sermon series entitled, "The Truth Will Set You Free," will come to its conclusion on August 1. A new series will start on August 15, entitled, "Good Teacher – Life Lessons from the Lord of Life." I look forward to sharing with you, as we continue to grow in God's Word.

## **Confirmation News**

One of the most important parts of the life of the church is Confirmation. For seventh (and sometimes eighth, ninth or tenth) graders, Confirmation provides an opportunity to really think about what it means to be a Christian, and it leads up to the Service of Confirmation, when young people "confirm" or "say yes" to the Christian faith.

Our Confirmation program is a combination of classroom experiences, where we focus on major elements of Christian faith, and local mission trips—where we put Christian faith into action. Our Confirmation Class generally gathers once a month on a Saturday. We have a class session at the church in the morning, followed by an afternoon trip.

Confirmation CONFIRMATION begins with а LUNCHEON, immediately following worship on Sunday, August 29. This is for all students grades seven and beyond who have not been confirmed, and their parents and families. You are invited to a light lunch, after which Rick Stout and Dave Palmer will explain the Confirmation program in detail. We should be finished by about 1:15 PM. It is very important that everyone planning to be a part of Confirmation be present for this luncheon. This is what will "bring you on board" with our Confirmation program. # Attention all third and fourth graders and their parents

As you enter the third or fourth grade this year, your church would like to present you with a very special gift—your very own Bible. The Bible is one of the most wonderful gifts that the church can give, because it contains God's message of salvation!

Bible Presentation Sunday will be September 19. During the early part of the 10:30 a.m. service, children and their parents will be called to the front of the sanctuary to receive Bibles. Parents are involved in the Bible presentation, because this is a way of recognizing the important role that parents play in enabling children to attend church.

Of course, the Bible only becomes really valuable when we use it. To this end, we have some powerful helps for children learning to use their Bible. First of all, our Sunday School enables children to really learn the Bible, how to use it, and how to apply its message to our lives. Secondly, we have a Bible mentor program. Each third or fourth grader is paired with an adult who will be his or her Bible mentor throughout the school year. Mentors guide children through a variety of activities that help them to enjoy, appreciate, and become familiar with their Bible. To begin the mentor experience, we invite all third and fourth graders, their parents, and mentors to a luncheon in Pierson Hall on Bible Presentation Sunday (September 19) at 11:40 AM. We will explain the Bible mentors program, and children and mentors will have an opportunity to get started together. The gathering will take place immediately following the 10:30 service.
