 Dear Friends,

We have hit a milestone in the history of the Kent church. At the end of June, I completed 26 years as the senior pastor here, thus surpassing the 25-year mark set by Carl Pierson. Pierson's tenure, from 1958 to 1983, was particularly notable,

as it occurred at a time when pastorates were typically much shorter. Even as the average length of a pastor's appointment has grown from 4 years in the 1950's to 7 years now, I never expected to surpass Carl's mark! But it has been wonderful journey to share with this congregation.

Of course, nothing on this earth lasts forever. I have recently informed our bishop that I expect to retire in two years, at the end of June, 2023 (our appointment year ends each June). At that point, I will have served 28 years in Kent and 44 years in ministry. Mavis will be retiring at the same time. We will be keeping our home in Kent but expect to do a good bit of traveling.

Our church does not need to form a search committee or plan for an interim, because in the Methodist system we already have the search committee in place – it is our bishop and the cabinet! They will be working carefully, in consultation with the Kent church, to identify the best possible person to come in as the new pastor in two years. We are blessed to have a very strong team of church leaders – volunteers and staff – to guide our church through the time of transition.

In the meantime, there are many opportunities coming up. If you have ever thought about taking Disciple Bible Study, and you thought you would want to do it with me as the teacher, you have two more chances – either this coming academic year or the next. Disciple I will meet this year on Tuesdays from 7:00 to 9:00 p.m., starting in mid-August, and it will have a Zoom option. We also are pleased to offer Disciple II, which is for anyone who has previously taken Disciple I. Disciple II offers an in-depth journey through Genesis–Exodus and Luke–Acts. The class will be led by Judith Nedel and will meet on Wednesdays from 7:00 to 9:00 p.m., starting in September. There are sign-up sheets in the atrium. See the Disciple article in this Mosaic for more information.

We also have an upcoming short-term study opportunity for adults which is described in an article in this Mosaic about climate-resilience workshops with Brugmansia Ministries.

Looking further ahead, I am pleased to announce a Kent church Bible Lands Tour, a little less than a year from now, when I will lead a group from this church on a 15-day tour through Turkey (sometimes called "the cradle of Christianity") and Israel. We will have complete information coming out soon.

The retirement date is set; but of course two years is still a good bit of time. I look forward to continuing to grow with you in faith and mission together.

### **Disciple Bible Study**

One of the most enriching opportunities in our church is **Disciple Bible Study**. This coming fall Dr. Palmer will be offering Disciple for the **twenty-seventh tim**e since his arrival here in 1995. The class's enduring popularity is a testimony to its power – it is a wonderful way to grow as a Disciple of Jesus Christ!

**Disciple I** takes participants on an overarching journey through the entire Bible in a span of 34 weeks. Through Disciple, people come to come to really know the Bible, to understand the Bible, and to see how the whole Biblical story connects together. Disciple will not simply expand your mind but will expand your spirit! It is an experience of growing in God's Word.

Disciple class participants read Bible passages each day (about a half hour's worth) and then come together once a week for a two-hour session. This fall the Disciple I class will meet on **Tuesdays** from 7:00 to 9:00 p.m., starting on August 17, with an orientation session, and concluding on May 17, with breaks over Thanksgiving, Christmas, and several other points. Here are some comments from this past year's participants about their experience in Disciple:

I looked forward to this meeting every week. I now have a greater sense of the Bible message.

This is the first time that I have stuck with reading the Bible.

I learned so much about the Bible and the history of the Israelites and the birth of Christianity. Seeing how God has continued to be faithful to people in spite of all their setbacks has deepened my faith.

Understanding the Scriptures has brought clarity to my view of Christ and God.

Disciple I is a great way to embrace the Bible.

I have a completely different outlook. I feel more devoted to God.

Disciple I has made me a better, kinder person and has helped me to talk to others about my faith.

I have also enjoyed meeting several new friends that I otherwise wouldn't have been able to know.

I learned so much during this nine month program. It will help me to continue to deepen my faith.

The reading was very manageable and enjoyable. I recommend this class for everyone.

What a blessing this has been.

Disciple is designed to be of value no matter where you are in your spiritual walk or your level of Bible knowledge. The main thing that is required is a commitment to the study. Participants are asked to "covenant" to do the daily Bible readings (with the aid of an accompanying study manual) and to be in regular attendance at the weekly sessions. We also ask that each participant contribute \$40 toward the cost of the study manual. Class size is limited, so sign up soon in the atrium or at kentmethodist.org/disciple.

All this will help to inform an actionable plan forward for KUMC. Meetings will be led by Claire and Mark Bank, along with Josh Richardson, the director of Brugmansia Ministries. This summer's VBS week has been moved to the week of July 12–16. This year's theme, **Knights of the North Castle,** is hidden in a frozen land. The King's valiant Knights are on a quest in search of the King's Armor. But the armor isn't what they think it is.
