Our church is making a difference in many ways. We encourage everyone in our congregation to "be a difference-maker," and this will be a major theme in our

church life during the month of October. On Oct 17, we will be doing "spiritual gift inventories" in worship, which provide an opportunity for people to volunteer to be in service in various ways in the ministries of our church. On Oct. 24, we will celebrate Consecration Sunday, when members and friends of our church have an opportunity to make a financial commitment to the work of Christ through our church for the coming year. On Oct. 31, Bishop Tracy Malone will be preaching at all three worship hours, and will also join with us in a church luncheon that day. Among other things, she will focus on the difference we are making in building a women's dormitory at Africa University. Also during October, we are collecting winter coats, hats, and gloves to distribute to needy people in Grundy County, Tennessee, where we do our youth mission trip each summer; you can bring new or nearly new coats, hats, and gloves to Rick Stout's office. Toward the end of the month, we organize to do a "make a difference week," when teams from our church do projects at the homes of members who need help. And of course we continue to make a difference through all of the ongoing ministries of the church.
