Dear Friends,

Last month we completed our "annual report" – a statistical summary of the past year that we submit every January to the United Methodist Church. In spite of Covid, 2021 was a strong year for our church in ministry. We contributed more than

\$175,000 to missions, supporting a broad range of outreach projects both locally and worldwide. We completed more than \$200,000 of needed projects in our church building, maintaining our wonderful facility that supports so many forms of ministry. Major projects included the ongoing organ renovation, the installation of new carpet in our Sunday School classrooms, the updating of education wing light bulbs to energy-efficient LED bulbs, the completion of a long-needed rest room renovation in the campus ministry wing, the purchase of new tables and chairs for Pierson Hall, further enhancements to the sanctuary audio/visual system, and the replacement of a large section of our flat roof (to stop a chronic leaking problem). In our church membership, we completed a major process of removing the names of long-term out-of-town inactives from the church rolls, in order to bring our membership lists up-to-date. We ended the year with 1003 members; the count does not include pre-teen children who have not yet been confirmed. We averaged 410 persons per Sunday in worship. At the beginning of the year, worship attendance was almost entirely online. In-person worship began to restart in late May, and by the end of the year nearly half the congregation was attending in-person, with more than half attending digitally. We ended the year in solid financial condition. Thanks to all who continue to be actively involved in the life and ministry of our church!

In worship during the month of February, the sermon series on the "Stories of the Kingdom" will continue. On February 20, we will welcome Rev. Bob Machovec to the pulpit; he will preach at all three worship hours. Rev. Machovec was the associate pastor of the United Methodist Church of Kent from 1980 to 1985. He came to our church after getting his Bachelor's Degree from Mount Union and his Master of Divinity from Vanderbilt Divinity School. Following his time in Kent, Bob served as the pastor of several churches across East Ohio until his retirement in 2016. In recent years he has been working part-time as the Chaplain/Bereavement Coordinator for Caring Hospice Services of Ohio. During our Wednesday Lenten series in March, Bob will be leading a three-week series entitled, "Caring for the Caregiver." Many of us find ourselves in the role of caregiver – caring for children or for a parent or spouse or other relative or for friends – and often we may be called upon to provide care in multiple directions simultaneously. But where do we find care for the caregiver? Bob will be addressing the challenges of the caregiver role in this series that will take place at 7:00 p.m. in the gym on March 9, 16, and 23. The series will also be livestreamed. More details will be in the March Mosaic.

Lent will begin on March 2, **Ash Wednesday**, which is relatively late this year. We will have a traditional services of ashes that day at 7:30 p.m. in the sanctuary. This very meaningful service uses the ancient symbolism of ashes to signify our repentance and the forgiveness of Christ. The service will be preceded by the first of our Lenten potlucks, which take place in Pierson Hall each Wednesday during Lent at 6:15.

Also during February, **Scout Sunday** will be on February 13. We will present Cub Scout religious awards during worship, and the Scouts will be holding a Pancake Brunch in Pierson Hall from 9:00 to 1:00. (This assumes that the present decline in omicron cases in our area continues.) Scouts receive freewill donations for the brunch. It's a great way for us to support our Scouting program!

#### Pave the Way

This past fall we launched a new two-year capital campaign to renovate our church parking lot. The project will include several components:

- The entire lot will be "milled" (the crumbly and crack-filled top layer taken off) and then covered with fresh asphalt. The last time we did this was 25 years ago.
- Deteriorated concrete sidewalks around the building will be replaced with new concrete. This affects multiple areas, where aging and uneven concrete has become a hazard.
- Problem areas in the parking lot will be corrected. The bothersome hump at the west entrance will be eliminated, and concrete will be laid in the trash dumpster area
- The whole lot will be freshly striped.

You can make a pledge at any time, and you can contribute by marking your donation, "Pave the Way." We hope to actually do the project in the summer of 2022, as the parking lot will definitely be in need at that point.

#### **Flower Calendar**

You can sign up to donate altar flowers in 2022 by registering on the flower calendar that is now posted in the atrium. Flowers are \$35 for a Sunday (which covers both arrangements). The flowers are delivered after worship by volunteers to shut-ins or people who have had recent health issues or losses in their family.

#### Kent Interfaith Alliance for Racial Reconciliation and Justice News

On Thursday, January 27th, KIFA hosted a Zoom showing of "Africa: A History Denied" with a discussion following. It is part of a series in an effort to learn some of the history that has contributed to the racism of today. There will be a monthly zoom presentation on February 24 at 7:30 probably sharing a film about Black Wall Street. More information will come on that later in the month. Look for fliers that will be out soon.

An important way for us to move forward in our journey toward the "Beloved Community" is to learn more of the history that we have missed including positive contributions as well as tragedies that have left scars that can only be healed if we work together.

KIFA is also working together with the Portage County NAACP and other community organizations to plan a peaceful and joy filled celebration for Juneteenth, June 19, 1865 the day that the Emancipation Proclamation was finally read in Texas. Last year Juneteenth was made a Federal Holiday.

KIFA also asks that you be aware and research State Bills 322 and 327 that seek to limit the teaching of the FULL history of our great country in both  $\kappa$ -12 and higher education.


