This month we head toward the celebration of Easter. Our worship services include many special elements:

Sunday, April 3— Worship at all hours will include the sacrament of **Communion**. The preacher for the day will be Judith Nedel, while Rev. Douglas Denton will preside over Communion. Judith has preached in our church in the past and has preached in several other churches in our District. She is currently seeking to be certified as a "lay speaker" in our Conference—a designation for persons who have taken course work in church leadership and who have gained experience in preaching.

Wednesday, April 6—Our final Lenten Wednesday program will be an **organ concert** by Dawn Filler at 7:00 p.m. in the sanctuary (also available digitally through our livestreaming). It will be preceded by the last of our Lenten potlucks this year, at 6:00 p.m. in Pierson Hall.

Sunday, April 10—We celebrate **Palm Sunday.** At the 10:30 hour, children will process with palm branches during the opening hymn. Rev. Douglas Denton will be preaching.

Thursday, April 14—Our **Maundy Thursday** service, at 7:30 p.m. in the sanctuary, will include Communion, as we remember the Last Supper, and it will then move into a Tenebrae service, which tells the story of the crucifixion with special music (presented by our Sanctuary Choir) and the symbolism of darkness.

Friday, April 15—We have a **Good Friday** service at 7:30 p.m. in the gymnasium, presented by our Worship Band. This year the structure of the service will be such that it will be **in-person** only. We invite you to *come to church* for this special opportunity to reflect about the meaning of the cross.

Easter, April 17—We rejoice in the good news of the Resurrection! I will be back in the pulpit. I will have been out of the office since March 28, the date of my hip replacement surgery. Our 8:30 and 10:30 services are both in the sanctuary, and our 9:30 service is in the gym as usual. From 9:00 to noon we have a **Paschal Breakfast** in Pierson Hall, featuring sweet breads and beverages. We need volunteers to bake items to contribute! Please sign up in the atrium.

Sunday, April 24—The "Life in Christ" sermon series continues

Sunday, May 1—Communion, plus Confirmation at 10:30.

We are blessed to have many capable leaders in our church who are involved in all the various elements of these special services!

Sunday, April 10 is Palm Sunday. We will be asking those children who come to the 9:30 Sunday school hour to stay and join with any children present for the 10:30 hour in order to lead our traditional Palm Sunday opening Palm parade. The parade will occur during the opening hymn of the 10:30 hour so children will not be asked to stay a long time.

Additionally, on Sunday May 15 those children who participate in our Children's choir will perform a musical during both the 9:30 and 10:30 hours. The Musical will showcase the songs that they have learned over the year in Sunday school. Please mark your calendars for that special day.

Contribute Your Reflections for a New Book

Have you ever been judged because of who you are? Many people in our church, at some point in their life, have experienced hurtful speech or negative treatment because of their race, sexual orientation, ethnicity, or some other personal quality. It can be most hurtful when that kind of judgment comes from people claiming to be Christians!

In the coming weeks, we are inviting people who have had that kind of experience to write a testimony or reflection, which will be included in a collection of essays that we will publish through our "Place to Grow" press (much as we publish an Advent devotional book each year). It is best if pieces are no more than a few pages in length. Please submit materials to Dr. Palmer at davepalmer@kentmethodist.org People who have witnessed judgment inflicted upon others may also wish to write a piece.

It is hoped that this collection can be both enlightening (for those who may not be aware of how their own speech and actions can be hurtful) and healing (for those who have experienced prejudice and exclusion). By making the publication available electronically through our web site, we hope to reach an audience much broader than our own local congregation.

The publication is timed to coincide with current developments in our denomination. With the delay of the United Methodist General Conference until 2024, some "traditionalist" churches (who do not fully accept LGBTQ persons) are planning to split off from the denomination over the next year. Our church in Kent is already clearly positioned; as a "reconciling congregation," we have a thoroughly stated welcoming and affirming attitude toward all! The publication of these essays will be an expression of why it is so important that Christians right now are a voice for affirmation rather than condemnation.

Our local church will be remaining in the United Methodist Church, which in 2024 is expected to begin a process of changing the language in our Discipline, our church rule book, to express a broadly welcoming attitude for the whole church.

Church Camp Photos Needed



Pave the Way

This past fall we launched a new two-year capital campaign to renovate our church parking lot. The project will include several components:

- The entire lot will be "milled" (the crumbly and crack-filled top layer taken off) and then covered with fresh asphalt. The last time we did this was 25 years ago.
- Deteriorated concrete sidewalks around the building will be replaced with new concrete. This affects multiple areas, where aging and uneven concrete has become a hazard.
- Problem areas in the parking lot will be corrected. The bothersome hump at the west entrance will be eliminated, and concrete will be laid in the trash dumpster area

• The whole lot will be freshly striped. You can make a pledge at any time, and you can contribute by marking your donation, "Pave the Way." We hope to actually do the project in the summer of 2022, as the parking lot will definitely be in need at that point.
