Pave the Way

Our Pave the Way campaign has the goal of doing a major renovation of our parking lot and church sidewalks. The entire asphalt parking lot will be milled (ground down), and two inches of new asphalt will be put down. The last time we did this was 25 years ago. The work will also include the elimination of "the hump" – the excessive slope in the west entrance which makes it easy to bottom out when you are trying to exit our parking lot onto East Main St. At the same time, we will be replacing numerous areas of deteriorated concrete around the building. You may have noticed that we removed several trees whose root systems had grown to the point of impinging on the concrete. We will not be replacing the sidewalk along the road, since the replacement of that walk is within the scope of work that the city envisions doing along with a future reworking of Rt. 59 in front of the church.

We are in need of contributions to the Pave the Way campaign! You can contribute any time by marking your donation "pave the way." We hope to do the project this July.

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED AT THE HAVEN

The Haven, the new homeless shelter in Portage County that is located on Rt. 59 between Kent and Ravenna, opened in mid-April and is currently appealing for volunteers. The biggest need is for monitors across several shifts. Monitors are responsible for doing hourly bed checks and ensuring the safety and security of the building and its guests throughout the late night through early morning. Additionally, two of the shifts perform lights-out or wake-up duties.

Shifts are: 9 pm-1 am — Lights-out/monitoring; 1 am-5 am — Monitoring; 5 am-9 am — Monitoring/ wake-up/breakfast. There is also an intake shift 5 pm-9 pm, which is much more highly involved: checking guests in, serving dinner, facilitating guest needs, etc. All volunteers need to be over 18, but there will be future opportunities for groups and youth to participate.

VBS is returning to the Kent UMC!

We are currently planning to hold VBS at the Kent UMC the week of June 13–16. (four days) The theme this year will be Food Truck Party where children of all ages to get on a roll with God as a parade of Food Trucks rolls into their neighborhood for the summer's biggest party!

This VBS invites children to pray as Jesus teaches us in Matthew 6:11; "Give us this day our daily bread." These words serve as a reminder that everything we have comes from God — and that it's by turning to God in prayer that all of our daily needs are met.

At the center of the Food Truck Party is a special food truck called "On a Roll." Here, Kids will learn from the food truck's Top Chef, along with DJ Cupcake (an adorable cupcake puppet), about the Daily Specials (Daily Learnings), which are lines from the wellloved prayer that teaches us to turn to God to meet our needs.
