The month of May includes many special elements in worship. We look forward to the following:

Sunday, May 1 - Confirmation Sunday and Communion. Our seventh graders who have completed the Confirmation class experience will be confirmed and received into membership during the 10:30 worship service. All worship hours will include the sacrament of Communion.

Sunday, May 8 – Mother's Day, also in our church called "The Festival of the Christian Home." In addition to the Mother's Day theme, there will be a brief video from our bishop at all three worship hours.

Sunday, May 15 - Children's presentation; Spiritual Gift Inventories Our children will present part of the morning message through word and song at the 9:30 and 10:30 services. The "Life in Christ" sermon series will continue at all three worship hours; and each hour will also include an opportunity to fill out a "Spiritual Gifts Inventory," which is a way of identifying avenues for participating in service and leadership in the church.

Sunday, May 22 – Youth Sunday. Our senior high and middle school youth are preparing special elements for this service, including skits, special music, readings, and a message from one of our graduating seniors, Jaden Lepp. Youth will be leading at all three worship hours. The 8:30 service will take place in the sanctuary.

Sunday, May 29 - Memorial Day weekend. Our worship will include a recognition moment for veterans. Rev. Denton will be preaching.

VBS is returning to the Kent UMC!

We are currently planning to hold VBS at the Kent UMC the week of June 13–16. (four days) The theme this year will be Food Truck Party where children of all ages to get on a roll with God as a parade of Food Trucks rolls into their neighborhood for the summer's biggest party!

TRASH AND TREASURE SALE Mega-sale planned for late August

Two years ago we initiated a new format for the Trash and Treasure Sale, in which we had a single large sale that had a long preparation time and utilized multiple rooms in the building. Tree Work

A significant amount of tree trimming and tree removal was undertaken on our church grounds in late April, in preparation for the paving of our parking lot this summer. Several aging trees that were destroying concrete sidewalks were removed; and some problem trees were removed or trimmed back from parking areas. We anticipate the paving work to begin in late June or July. You can contribute to the paving project by marking your contribution "Pave the Way."

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED AT THE HAVEN

The Haven, the new homeless shelter in Portage County that is located on Rt. 59 between Kent and Ravenna, opened in mid-April and is currently appealing for volunteers. The biggest need is for monitors across several shifts. Monitors are responsible for doing hourly bed checks and ensuring the safety and security of the building and its guests throughout the late night through early morning. Additionally, two of the shifts perform lights-out or wake-up duties.

Shifts are: 9 pm-1 am — Lights-out/monitoring; 1 am-5 am — Monitoring; 5 am-9 am — Monitoring/ wake-up/breakfast. There is also an intake shift 5 pm-9 pm, which is much more highly involved: checking guests in, serving dinner, facilitating guest needs, etc. All volunteers need to be over 18, but there will be future opportunities for groups and youth to participate.
