Dear Friends,

I am happy to announce the new dates for the **Bible Lands Tour.** We delayed the tour until 2023 due to Covid concerns in the past year. The tour will now happen from June 16 to July 1, 2023.

The Bible Lands Tour offers an extraordinary journey through the "cradle of Christianity" in Turkey and all the major Biblical sites in Israel. We will see spectacular ancient ruins and spiritually inspiring locations, where you will walk in the footsteps of Jesus and the apostles. We will also see amazing natural wonders, plus some of the most famous Islamic sites in the world. I will be leading the tour, providing an overview and spiritual context in each place, while we will have local guides explaining the specifics of each location. The full tour is described in detail in a brochure that is available at the church and that can also be viewed in digital form through our web site at www.kentmethodist.org.

We managed to get the cost of the tour \$300 *lower* that it was priced last year. The cost is \$5,596 per person, which includes nearly everything – the flights to and from Istanbul and Tel Aviv, flights within Turkey, all transportation within Turkey and Israel, entrance fees and guides, first class hotels in every place, and breakfast and dinner each day. Travelers will cover their own lunch costs, plus souvenirs!

People always wonder about safety when it comes to traveling to the Holy Land. I have been to Israel twice – in 1979 and in 1994 (also to Turkey that year) – and people were always worried about safety, because we always hear about unrest in that part of the world. But when was the last time you heard about tourists there being harmed? The fact is that travel in Israel and Turkey is extremely safe, undoubtedly safer than walking through some U.S. cities. There are two key reasons for this. First, many of the people living in tourist destinations are making their livelihood from tourism; they all are highly motivated to ensure that tourists stay safe! Secondly, the tour operators are very skilled at knowing exactly what is going on in each area. They avoid any potential trouble spots. I felt safer in Jerusalem than in many other places I've been.

The timing of the tour was selected because it is ideal for multiple reasons. In terms of calendar, it avoids the regular school sessions of KSU and area public schools. In terms of climate, it is a delightful time of the year in Turkey and Israel, with mostly sunny skies and moderate temperatures. Late June temperatures in Istanbul and Jerusalem are generally in the 60s for lows and 80s for highs. Some locations are warmer, such as Antalya on the southern Turkish coast, where June highs are in the 90s, but there you can also swim in the Mediterranean! The warmer season will be appreciated by anyone who does the optional sunrise balloon flight in Cappadocia; temperature at lift off will be around 50 (wear layers). The tour will extend across my final days as the pastor of the Kent church. My last Sunday in the pulpit will be June 11. The tour departs the following Friday (June 16) and returns on Saturday, July 1. The new pastor's first Sunday in the pulpit will be the next day, July 2.

### Attention all third graders and their parents

As you enter the third grade this year, your church would like to present you with a very special gift -- your very own Bible. The Bible is one of the most wonderful gifts that the church can give, because it contains God's message of salvation!

Bible Presentation Sunday will be August 21. During the early part of the 10:30 a.m. service, third graders and their parents will be called to the front of the sanctuary to receive Bibles. Parents are involved in the Bible presentation, because this is a way of recognizing the important role that parents play in enabling children to attend church.

Of course, the Bible only becomes really valuable when we use it. To this end, we have some powerful helps for third graders learning to use their Bible. First of all, our Sunday School enables children to really learn the Bible, how to use it, and how to apply its message to our lives. Secondly, we have a Bible mentor program. Each third grader is paired with an adult who will be his or her Bible mentor throughout the school year. Men-

tors guide third graders through a variety of activities that help them to enjoy, appreciate, and become familiar with their Bible. To begin the mentor experience, we invite all third graders, their parents, and mentors to a luncheon in the parlor on Bible Presentation Sunday (August 21) at 11:40 AM. We will explain the Bible mentors program, and children and mentors will have an opportunity to get started together. The gathering will take place immediately following the 10:30 service.

### **Confirmation News**

One of the most important parts of the life of the church is Confirmation. For seventh (and sometimes eighth, ninth or tenth) graders, Confirmation provides an opportunity to really think about what it means to be a Christian, and it leads up to the Service of Confirmation, when young people "confirm" or "say yes" to the Christian faith.

Our Confirmation program is a combination of classroom experiences, where we focus on major elements of Christian faith, and local mission trips -- where we put Christian faith into action. Our Confirmation Class generally gathers once a month on a Saturday. We have a class session at the church in the morning, followed by an afternoon trip.

Confirmation begins with a CONFIRMATION LUNCHEON, immediately following worship on Sunday, August 28. This is for all students grades seven and beyond who have not been confirmed, and their parents and families. You are invited to a light lunch, after which Rick Stout and Dave Palmer will explain the Confirmation program in detail. We should be finished by about 1:15 PM. It is very important that everyone planning to be a part of Confirmation be present for this luncheon. This is what will "bring you on board" with our Confirmation program. ### **Disciple Bible Study**

Time is running out to sign up for Disciple Bible Study! Disciple I, which takes participants through the entire Bible across 34 weeks, is starting on August 8, meeting on Monday nights from 7:00 to 9:00. (The orientation on August 8 starts at 8:00 p.m.) Disciple III, for people who have previously completed Disciple I, will meet on Wednesday nights, starting August 31. It provides an in-depth journey through the prophets and the letters of Paul. Sign up for Disciple I or Disciple III through our web site, or on the sign-up sheets in the church atrium.

### **Book Published**

A new book by Dr. Palmer will be coming out in August entitled, *Rightly Reading the Good Book*. It deals with how to rightly understand the many parts of the Bible – a critical subject in these days when the Bible is so often distorted and abused!
