We have a special opportunity coming up this month on every Sunday in October! Our worship schedule is as follows:

Oct. 2 World Communion Sunday. We celebrate our spiritual unity with Christians all around the world. Following worship, teams from our church will take Communion elements to shut-ins in our congregation.

Oct. 9 50 Year Member Recognition. We are recognizing all those who have been members of our church for more than fifty years. There will be a recognition moment in each of our three morning worship hours, and then we will have a luncheon at 11:30 in Pierson Hall in honor of all those recognized. Everyone is invited!
