A great deal is happening in September, as we move into our full fall schedule!

- Sunday School resumes on September 4 at the 9:30 hour, and continues at the 10:30 hour. We offer child care and Sunday School classes at both 9:30 and 10:30. The Sunday School experience at 9:30 also includes a music component led by Chelsea Alderson.
- The Church Picnic will take place on September 11, beginning at 11:30 in Pierson Hall. There will be various games and a bounce house for children. Families are encouraged to come for a fun event; and all the food is provided!
- Youth Group resumes its regular Sunday evening gatherings, beginning September 11. Youth Group is open to all sixth through twelfth graders. It meets from 7:00 to 8:30 p.m. each Sunday.
