Dear Friends,

About every six years, Christmas lands on a Sunday, and it is happening this year! Whenever this occurs, we have a single joint worship service on Christmas

morning and also on New Year's Day. The service will be at 10:00 a.m. in the sanctuary. Here is a chance to add a very special element to your celebrations on Christmas morning and on New Year's Day! On Christmas day, our service will include a lot of singing of Christmas carols. The whole service will be suitable for children; children are even welcome to come in their PJs! There will be no Sunday School, although child care will be offered for the smallest children. On New Year's Day, the service will be a Covenant Renewal Service. Based on a service written by John Wesley, this service provides a wonderful spiritual beginning to the new year, as it guides us to renew our covenant with God.

Throughout the month, we have many special elements in worship. Our calendar is as follows:

- Sunday, December 4 Second Sunday in Advent, Communion. We continue to light the Advent wreath. The new sermon series, entitled, "God's Answer to the World's Need," will continue throughout the month.
- Sunday, December 11 Third Sunday in Advent, Children's Christmas Pageant. Our children will present a short Christmas pageant as a portion of our worship during the 9:30 and 10:30 hours.
- Sunday, December 18 Fourth Sunday in Advent, Christmas Cantata and Youth Play. At the 8:30 and 10:30 worship hours, the main portion of worship will be a cantata presented by an expanded New Spirit ensemble and a small orchestra, led by Nik Stackpole. At the 9:30 hour, the message of the morning will come to us via a Christmas play presented by our youth. These services are always very meaningful and uplifting.
- Saturday, December 24 Christmas Eve candlelight services at 7:00 and 9:00 p.m. Note that there will be an extended musical prelude prior to both services. The early service will feature a musical blend, with our Worship Band leading some segments and our organ leading other parts of the service. The prelude music, by our Worship Band, will start at 6:45 pm. The late service will be very traditional and will feature our Sanctuary Choir. The prelude music will start at 8:30 p.m. Child care and bus transportation will be offered for the 7:00 service only.

Sunday, December 25 – Christmas Day. Single worship service at 10:00 a.m. in the sanctuary.

Sunday, January 1 – New Year's Day. Single worship service at 10:00 a.m. in the sanctuary.

Sunday, January 8 – Epiphany Sunday, Communion. We return to our usual schedule of three worship hours.

Christmas Movie

We are showing the movie, which runs about an hour and a half, in our church gymnasium on Friday, December 16, at 7:00 p.m. This is suitable for all ages! Christmas cookies and beverages will be available. Dr. Palmer will provide a brief commentary and closing prayer after the film.

Our Church Partners with Habitat for Humanity Help build a new home this Christmas

Along with several other area churches, our church is partnering with Habitat for Humanity to do an "Apostle Build" in Ravenna, on Summit Rd. The term "Apostle Build" describes the building of a house that is supported by a coalition of churches. Work has already started on the property and foundation, and the family needing the home has been selected. It is a family with five children, four of whom are still at home. The first step is fundraising. At UMC Kent, we are seeking to raise at least \$10,000 to contribute to the project, and we are using our Christmas offering to that end. Simply mark a contribution "Christmas Offering" to participate! We will be looking for volunteers of various sorts in the months to come, starting in the spring. There will be new communications as different phases of the project develop.

Church Table at the Farmers' Market

During the winter months, starting in December, we host the Farmers' Market in Pierson Hall and in the gym. It is quite popular, especially in December! This year we want to have a church table, primarily for the purpose of letting all the visitors know about our church! We will have church brochures available and also Dr. Palmer's books for sale (proceeds from the sales support the church). We need volunteers to staff the table! The market is open from 10:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. each Saturday, starting December 4, but it will not be operating on Christmas or New Year's days.
