Dear Friends,

On Sunday, January 15, the chairperson of our Staff-Parish Relations Committee, Rhonda Wight, announced who the new senior pastor of our church will be. Bishop

Malone is appointing Dr. Nathan Howe to serve the Kent congregation, starting July 1, 2023. Dr. Howe earned his bachelor's degree from Ohio Northern University and his master's and doctorate from Wesley Theological Seminary (Wesley, one of our United Methodist seminaries, is adjacent to American University in Washington, D.C.) He served churches in Tiffin from 2008 to 2012, served as the pastor of the Niles United Methodist Church from 2012 to 2016, and since 2016 has been the senior pastor at the Berea United Methodist Church. He thus brings a breadth of experience and a familiarity with a campus community. Dr. Howe has been in several leadership positions in our East Ohio Conference. In the coming months, he will have opportunity to begin to become acquainted with the Kent church, although of course he is still serving full time in Berea! We look forward to welcoming him and his wife, Megan, to Kent this summer.

As you know, Rev. Douglas Denton is also retiring at the end of June this summer. Our Staff-Parish Relations Committee has concluded that it is best to let the new pastor participate in shaping the staff going forward, so we expect there will be a span of time this summer when Dr. Howe is the only pastor at the Kent church. We encourage everyone to keep in mind how busy he will be!

In our church life this February, I will be starting a new sermon series on Feb. 19 entitled, "Living in the Vine." Throughout the month, Dr. Jeffrey Wattles is leading a University of Life class entitled, "Let's Help One Another Live the Golden Rule." The class meets from 9:30 to 10:20 every Sunday morning in the Conference room and is open to all adults. We also recently published a new book, *Other Sheep Not of This Fold*, which deals with the issue of how Christians should think about people who are in other religions. Copies are available from the church office or from Amazon.

The season of Lent begins this year on February 22, **Ash Wednesday**. We will have a traditional service of ashes that day at 7:30 p.m. in the sanctuary. This very meaningful service uses the ancient symbolism of ashes to signify our repentance and the forgiveness of Christ. The service will be preceded by the first of our Lenten potlucks, which take place in Pierson Hall each Wednesday during Lent at 6:00.

Our **Wednesday Lenten series** which follows will feature our traditional music ministry and will particularly highlight our renovated sanctuary organ. On each Wednesday of March, starting March 1, there will be a half hour musical program in the sanctuary starting at 7:00 p.m. More details will follow in the March Mosaic.

At the end of February, we will celebrate **Scout Sunday** on February 26. We will present Cub Scout religious awards during worship, and the Scouts will be holding a Pancake Brunch in Pierson Hall from 9:00 to 1:00. Scouts receive freewill donations for the brunch. It is a great way for us to support our Scouting program!

First I am excited to announce that on the weekend of February 24–25 the youth will be participating in the 30 Hour Famine!

You may not be aware of this, but the world is experiencing its worse hunger crisis in decades. Conflict, COVID-19 and climate change are driving a deadly combination worldwide. The number of people facing daily hunger doubled in 2020 and now sits at 270 million. One in eight people in developing countries do not have enough to eat. Daily 6,000 children under the age of five die from preventable hunger related causes.
