Dear Friends,

Because the first Sunday of the month this January is New Year's Day – when we have one worship service at 10:00 – we will be celebrating Communion on January 8, which is **Epiphany Sunday**. This is the day that we remember the visit of the wise men to the infant Jesus. On the following Sunday, January 15, the sermon series on "God's Answer to the World's Need" will come to its conclusion.

On Sunday, January 22, our **District Superintendent will visit**. D.S. Angela Lewis will present the sermon at all three worship hours. This will likely be close to the time when we find out who the new lead pastor in Kent will be.

The new pastor for UMC Kent will be selected through a careful, consultative process that is led by our Bishop Tracy Malone and that includes the District Superintendents (who form the Cabinet) and our own Staff-Parish Committee, which has already provided a good deal of input. Bishop Malone has known of the opening in Kent for a year and a half, and she is well acquainted with our church, so she has had much time to consider who the best candidate will be. In our United Methodist process, there is not a series of interviews, nor are there trial sermons or congregational votes. The Bishop and Cabinet select the pastor that they feel is the best match for the church, and our Staff-Parish Committee will have an interview with that candidate to confirm (or reject) the selection. Once the new pastor is confirmed by all the parties involved, an announcement will be made in Sunday morning worship. This will likely happen in January or February. The new pastor will not start until July 1, but will have several months to get "on board" with Kent church processes and leadership before then. On Sunday, January 29, it will be **UMW Sunday**, when our United Methodist Women take the overall leadership in our Sunday morning services. The sermon will be brought by Carol Pozuc, and there will be other special elements in worship.

On Martin Luther King weekend (Sunday, January 15), we take a special offering for the **Black College Fund**. Our United Methodist church has eleven historically black United Methodist colleges that are scattered across the southern states. These schools were founded in the aftermath of the Civil War, when African-Americans were routinely denied the opportunity to pursue higher education. The eleven colleges – Bennett College, Bethune-Cookman University, Claflin University, Clark Atlanta University, Dillard University, Huston-Tillotson University, Meharry Medical College, Paine College, Philander Smith College, Rust College, and Wiley College – opened the door in the nineteenth century for African-Americans to enter into career fields that had long been closed to them, and these schools continue to provide very important opportunities especially for ethnic minority students today. Our Kent church seeks to give \$1100 to the Black College Fund each year (\$100 for each school). You can contribute at any time by marking a contribution "Black College Fund."
