Dear Friends,

We continue to journey this month through the season of Lent. Each Wednesday, we will have a Lenten potluck in Pierson Hall, starting at 6:00 p.m. Bring a food item to share plus table service; beverages are provided. Following the potluck, starting at 7:00 p.m., there will be a Lenten Program in the sanctuary. This year we are having a musical series, as we continue to celebrate the renovation of our sanctuary organ. In Sunday worship, Rev. Denton will be preaching on March 5, when we will also have the sacrament of Communion; and then the sermon series entitled "Living in the Vine" will continue through the rest of the month. *Remember to turn your clocks ahead on Sunday, March 12.* Holy Week begins April 2, and we will have details about Holy Week services in the April Mosaic.

Did you know that we average more than 450 people in worship each Sunday? No matter when you attend worship in our church, you never get a sense of this number. If you attend one of our three in-person services, you do not see all the people who are attending the other two, and you not see the more than 250 people who attend our services online each week. If you attend online, you see the some of the people in either the contemporary or the traditional service, depending on which online service you attend, but of course you do not see the many other people who are also attending online. As a result, it is easy to get the impression that our church attendance has seriously dwindled, when in fact the opposite is the case. In 1995, when we had two in-person services, our average Sunday worship attendance was 332. In 2022, when we had three in-person services and two livestream worship offerings, our average worship attendance was 479. This growth is also reflected in our church finances. Giving has increased year to year, and our church financial position is now the strongest it has ever been.

As churches across the country are discovering, we are in a new world in this post-pandemic worship environment. Many churches are in fact shrinking; but others, like ours, have reshaped our approach to embrace online worship and are thriving, yet the dynamics of worship are quite different from what they used to be. For longtime worshippers, this requires some adjustment in perspective. When we worship, we need to realize that although we cannot see most of our fellow worshippers, we are in fact in spiritual fellowship with a large congregation of fellow believers. But of course, this sort of reality has been a feature of Christian worship for centuries. Christians have long held the conviction that whenever we gather in worship, we are in spiritual fellowship with an unseen throng of the faithful – believers in other churches and all the saints in heaven! As we worship today, we continue to be bound together through the Holy Spirit, and we can rejoice in our connection in Lord.

Every day, 1 in 10 people do not have enough to eat, thousands of children under the age of five are

dying daily from hunger-related causes. On the weekend of February 24th and 25th, 8of our youth participated once again in World Visions 30 Hour Famine. For 30 hours, the youth of our church went hungry to raise funds to help hungry children around the world. This annual event creates an opportunity for our youth to make a huge impact on the continual problem of hunger and poverty both locally and worldwide, while at the same time experiencing in a small taste of what hunger is like. During the course of the weekend students fed the hungry at the Lords Lunch and canned goods were collected and donated to the food pantry at Kent Social Services.
