Dear Friends,

This month we head toward the celebration of Easter. Our worship services include many special elements:

Sunday, April 3 - Palm Sunday. At the 10:30 hour, children will process with palm branches. Worship at all hours will include the sacrament of **Communion**.

Thursday, April 6 – Our **Maundy Thursday** service, at 7:30 p.m. in the sanctuary, will include Communion, as we remember the Last Supper, and it will then move into a Tenebrae service, which tells the story of the crucifixion with special music (presented by our Sanctuary Choir) and the symbolism of darkness.

Friday, April 7 – We have a **Good Friday** service at 7:30 p.m. in the gymnasium, presented by our Worship Band. This service utilizes multiple elements to help us to reflect about the meaning of the cross.

Easter, April 9 – We rejoice in the good news of the Resurrection! We have a new element this year in our Easter services – a sunrise service at 7:30 in the chapel in the woods. This will be a shorter (half hour or less) praise service, in which we recall the Easter story that "very early on the first day of the week, when the sun had risen, the women went to the tomb." (Mark 16:2) This will be the first use of our chapel in the woods! New seating was recently completed through an Eagle project by Chase Williams. The chapel in the woods as a whole is the result of multiple Eagle projects and work projects by our Scouts and other volunteers. You access the chapel in the woods via a path; note that the terrain is not favorable for anyone who has difficulty walking. Wear casual clothing, suitable for whatever the weather is. If it is raining, there is a covered pavilion in which we can gather. Our regular Easter services, which include the sermon of the morning, will be at 8:30 and 10:30 in the sanctuary and 9:30 in the gym. From 8:00 to noon we have a Paschal Breakfast in Pierson Hall, featuring sweet breads and beverages. We need volunteers to bake items to contribute! Please sign up in the atrium or on the Volunteer Opportunities page on our website.

Sunday, April 16 – Children's Musical. Our children will present a brief musical at both the 9:30 and 10:30 worship hours. The "Living in the Vine" sermon series continues

Sunday, April 23 - Youth Sunday. Our senior high and middle school youth will present the main elements of the worship service at all three worship hours. This will include drama, a message, and special music.

Sunday, April 30 – Sacrament of Baptism. The sacrament of baptism for children is being offered this Sunday. Interested parents should be in touch with the church office.

We are blessed to have many capable leaders in our church who are involved in all the various elements of these special services!


