Siblings in Christ,

I am deeply grateful to God through Bishop Tracy S. Malone and our East Ohio Conference cabinet for the opportunity to come alongside you all in ministry in Kent beginning this July. Since this past January, when it was announced that I would be appointed as pastor to the United Methodist Church in Kent, I have been blessed with opportunities to meet with Rev. Palmer, with many members of the UMC of Kent staff, and with the Staff Parish Relations Committee. Through their generosity, I have received a tour through your building, walked through your woods and visited your new outdoor chapel, and driven through different sections of town, including the Kent State University campus. At every step, I have been blessed to hear exciting stories about the incredible ways God has been and is working among and through your congregation to share and to celebrate Christ's love with your neighbors. We are currently planning to hold VBS at the Kent UMC the week of June 6–9. (Tuesday through Friday, four days)


This years theme is Hero Hotline!
