Dear Friends,

We are moving quickly towards a time of transition in our church, as our pastoral leadership will change at the end of June. Please keep in mind the following dates and opportunities:

Sunday, June 11 – This will be my last preaching Sunday in the church. I will still be the senior pastor through the end of June, but I will be spending the last half of the month leading our Bible Lands Tour.

Sunday, June 25 – This will be Rev. Denton's last preaching Sunday. There will be a recognition of his outstanding leadership. His last day on our church staff is June 30.

Sunday, July 2 - The congregation welcomes Dr. Nathan Howe as the new senior pastor.

July into the fall -- There will be a series of neighborhood gatherings, during which small groups will meet in homes for an evening of conversation with Dr. Howe. This is a prime opportunity for Dr. Howe to get to know you. The format will focus on church members sharing their experiences in the church and their hopes for the future, with Dr. Howe listening and learning who this congregation is. Be sure to sign up for one of the available dates!

In this transition, one key element is that the outgoing pastors must not "hang on" in the church once the new pastor has arrived. There needs to be space for Dr. Howe to form relationships and lead the church into new directions in the future. For this reason, we have a Conference rule that an outgoing pastor must not return to the church for at least a year; and in the case of a very long-term pastorate, the outgoing pastor should keep a distance from the church for a considerably longer period. Both Rev. Denton and I will continue to live in the area, but we will both necessarily begin worshipping in other United Methodist churches. We also will not be returning for any weddings or funerals. Although it is natural in such times to want to seek out the pastor with whom you have had a long relationship, it will be very valuable in precisely such times to seek out Dr. Howe, as he will be leading the church week to week and will be able to provide continuing spiritual care. You will find him to be a compassionate and gifted pastor who is well able to accompany people through times of both grief and joy.
