Holy Week Worship Schedule

Palm/Passion Sunday: April 13

8:30 am in the Chapel; 9:30 am in the Palmer Gym; 10:30 am in the Sanctuary

Holy Week begins by embodying its sharp contrasts. In the palm procession, we experience the joyous parade of Jesus' entry into Jerusalem. In the concluding reading of the Gospel, we are confronted by Jesus' suffering. By tis sharp contrast, we are reminded of our various seasons of faithfulness: that our lives are filled both with joy and with suffering, with times of following Jesus closely and with times of falling away.

Maundy Thursday: April 17

7 pm in the Sanctuary

On Maundy Thursday, named for the command or "mandate" Jesus gives us to love one another, we remember Jesus' example of servanthood and celebrate God's presence with us in the Lord's Supper (Communion).

Good Friday: April 18

7 pm in the Palmer Gym

Our worship on Good Friday continues the service begun on Maundy Thursday. We will move to the Palmer Gym, and the modern worship team will lead us in songs while our scripture readings lead us into the story of Jesus' suffering, abandonment, and death.

Easter Sunday: April 20

7:30 am in the Outdoor Chapel; 8:30 am in the Sanctuary;

9:30 am in the Palmer Gym; 10:30 am in the Sanctuary

The Easter Season, also known as the Great Fifty Days of Easter, begins at sunset on Easter Eve and continues to the Day of Pentecost (this year, on June 8). This is our most joyous season and the core of the entire Christian year. Together in worship, we focus on Christ's resurrection as the triumph of God's love over all the powers of death and the continuing invitation to us to live as Easter people, sharing God's love with the world.

New Ministry Teams for Emerging Opportunities

Throughout recent months, we have been in an ongoing process of discovery and discernment, responding together to God's call on our lives as individuals and our life together as a faithful congregation in ministry with our neighbors. To help plan and guide new and emerging ministry opportunities, we have formed a few new teams which meet regularly and are open to all who are interested in being involved, helping to shape our life together. Community Connections Team

The Community Connections Team focuses on opportunities to build relationships with our neighbors and neighborhood through hands-on service and generosity, including service projects, social justice and advocacy ministries, and participating in community gatherings on behalf of UMCK. During the past year, this team began our monthly "Loving Our Neighbors" collections, coordinated opportunities to serve at the Lord's Lunch and Miller Community House, and organized our presence at the Kent Heritage Festival, among other ministry opportunities. This team meets every second Tuesday of the month at 6 pm.

LGBTQ+ Ministry Team

The LGBTQ+ Ministry Team is a group of LBGTQ+ persons and allies committed to increasing the witness of our congregation as a community of faith where all persons will be loved and celebrated as beloved children of God and will find a place of belonging. During the past year, this team hosted our "Safe Space: Ally Training" from the Kent State University LGBTQ+ Center, coordinated our congregation's presence at Pride festivals in Cleveland, Canton, Akron, Kent State University, and the city of Kent, and is exploring more opportunities for advocacy and fellowship.

Green Team

The Green Team is committed to helping the congregation become more informed and involved regarding the current climate crisis and opportunities to be faithful stewards of the goodness of God's earth. Some participants on this team have attended training events through the East and West Ohio Conferences of our United Methodist Church, and we are looking forward to increasing opportunities to live our faith in connection with all creation. This team meets monthly on Sundays after the 10:30 am worship service.

Communication Ministry Team

The Communication Ministry Team is focused on developing effective communication both within the congregation and between the congregation and the broader community. Current areas of focus are the redesign of our UMCK website and exploring options for "welcome centers" or "connection points" within our building and increasing UMCK's online presence. This team meets monthly on Thursday evenings.

Ministry with Migrants Team

The Ministry with Migrants Team has been formed in response to a webinar on February 10 from our United Methodist Church called "Solidarity with the Sojourners" (www.resourceumc.org/en/content/solidarity-with-the-sojourners). This team is focused on exploring opportunities to be in ministry with migrant families and communities in our region and advocating for public policies that align with our faithful commitments to justice, compassion, and dignity for all.

Sunday Afternoon Walk


Sunday, April 13 4 pm at Dix Park

Remember the events of Good Friday as we walk through downtown Kent.


Meet in the parking lot of First Christian

The Serviceberry: Abundance and Reciprocity in the Natural World by Robin Wall Kimmerer

Tuesday, April 1, at 7 pm in the Conference Room

As Indigenous scientist (and author of Braiding Sweetgrass) Robin Wall Kimmerer harvests serviceberries




alongside the birds, she considers the ethic of reciprocity that lies at the heart of the gift economy. How, she asks, can we learn from Indigenous wisdom and the plant world to reimagine what we value most? Our economy is rooted in scarcity, competition, and the hoarding of resources, and we have surrendered our values to a system that actively harms what we love. Meanwhile, the serviceberry's relationship with the natural world is an embodiment of reciprocity, interconnectedness, and gratitude. The tree distributes its wealth—its abundance of sweet, juicy berries—to meet the needs of its natural community, and this distribution ensures its own survival. As

Kimmerer explains, "Serviceberries show us another model, one based upon reciprocity, where wealth comes from the quality of your relationships, not from the illusion of self-sufficiency."

Stride Toward Freedom: The Montgomery Story

by Martin Luther King, Jr. Tuesday, May 13, at 7 pm in the Conference Room

Written just two years after the successful completion of the boycott of the Montgomery, Alabama bus system,



a young Rev. King tells the stories that informed his thinking before, during, and after the boycott—from first witnessing economic injustice as a teenager and watching his parents experience discrimination to his decision to begin working with the NAACP. Throughout, he demonstrates how activism and leadership can come from any experience at any age. Both comprehensive and intimate, Stride Toward Freedom emphasizes the collective nature of the movement and includes King's experiences learning from others, including Rosa Parks and Claudette Colvin. In so doing, it provides wisdom for our ongoing collective movements for social change as we seek together a

more beloved world.
